

NYSAR Calls on Mayor Adams to Veto the FARE Act

STATEMENT

The New York State Association of REALTORS[®] (NYSAR) is calling on Mayor Eric Adams to veto the Intro 360-A, the FARE Act, as he has correctly raised concerns about the impact of the legislation on property owners and the increased rents for future renters.

NYSAR remains firm in its opposition to Int. 360-A. The City Council's decision to approve this misguided legislation without collaboration from industry partners is unfortunate and does not consider immediate and long-term harmful impacts it will have on both hardworking real estate professionals and tenants in search of safe, affordable housing.

The FARE Act will undoubtedly lead to higher rents and reduced access to available rental listings for prospective tenants, exacerbating housing affordability challenges New Yorkers already face.

New Yorkers deserve better policies that improve housing accessibility and affordability while recognizing the livelihoods of thousands of hardworking small business owners. NYSAR will continue to consider all options to fight this ill-conceived legislation on behalf of its REALTOR[®] members across all five boroughs.
